ROAD ACCIDENT VICTIM WHO DIED AFTER FIVE YEARS IN COMA

HC cites 'pain, shock & suffering' of family, doubles compensation

25 years later, the Court says it must be treated as a case of fatal accident

TWENTY-FIVE years after a road accident left a Rajkot man comatose for five years before his death, the Gujarat High Court has more than doubled the compensation awarded to his family by a tribunal in 2004.

The court raised the total award to Rs 12.12 lakh and categorically held that the deceased could not be blamed for any negligence whatsoever in the "fatal accident case".

Bringing relief to the family that had fought a legal battle since the 2001 accident, Justice Nisha Thakore of the Gujarat HC allowed the appeal filed by Bhagvanji Bhutani's widow, Champa Bhutani, and their son against the 2004 judgment and award of the Motor Accident Claims Tribunal (AMCT) in Gondal town

of Rajkot district. The HC cited that the tribunal committed a grave error in treating it as a case of injury claims "as it was required to be treated as a fatal accident case". It ruled that because of death—brain injury from the accident—had made a fatal accident case in law, with the multiplier method applicable to dependency loss rather than future loss of income.

The court considered the post-mortem note, which recorded the cause of death as "cardiorespiratory failure due to complications of coma-brain injury". Rejecting the insurance company's argument, citing another case of accident, the court said, "...in the present case, the injured has succumbed to fatal injuries as evident from the

post-mortem report..." The order states: "The Tribunal failed to live up to the objective of beneficial legislation, which otherwise aims at just and reasonable amount of compensation to be awarded." The HC awarded Rs 3 lakh for "pain, shock and suffering".

The HC directed the insurance company to deposit the enhanced compensation of Rs 6.99 lakhs with interest at 7.5 per cent per annum from the date of filing of the claim petition, within six weeks of receipt of the certified copy of the order. The total compensation payable, including the amount already awarded by the tribunal, now stands at Rs 12.12 lakhs. The Tribunal at Gondal was directed to disburse the amount in accordance with Supreme Court guidelines on ap-

portionment. As per the petition, Bhagvanji Bhutani, a transport contractor who was 45 years old at the time of the accident, was riding his motorcycle when a van struck him on the National Highway in Gondal in March 2001. Bhutani suffered severe head injuries including critical internal brain trauma. In the collision, he was first treated at Gondal Hospital and later shifted to Rajkot, where he remained bedridden and in a coma for the remainder of his life until his death on May 2, 2006.

His wife Champa and son filed a claim petition on April 23, 2001. Thirteen years later, in June 2004, the Tribunal awarded Rs 5.13 lakhs with an interest of 7.5 per cent but also attributed 10% contributory negligence to the deceased, reducing what was already in the appellants' submission, "an inordinate award". The family filed an appeal in the HC in 2015. The appeal took another 11 years to be finally heard and decided on May 5.

In the order, made available on Tuesday, the HC noted the submissions of the advocate for the family, DD Vyas, who challenged the impugned award of the Tribunal on the aspect of

"negligence" attributed to the deceased and the "quantum". On negligence, the advocate argued that the Tribunal had assigned no specific reasoning to justify holding the deceased contributorily negligent to 10%. He also submitted that the respondents had not examined a single independent witness not produced any counter-evidence.

The court also considered the submission that the attendant charges of Rs. 24,000 were "inadequate and unrealistic". Advocate PH Thakkar, appearing for the insurance company defended the award and argued that since the accident had occurred on a National Highway and the deceased was entering the gate of the market yard at the time, it was "duty cast upon the person who is entering into the main road to take care of the surroundings". Justice Thakore, who undertook a reappraisal of the evidence and the law, applied the Supreme Court's 2013 ruling, which had struck down a similar finding of contributory negligence. The order states, "It is apparent that the Tribunal has not assigned any reason to arrive at such a conclusion holding the deceased contributorily negligent to the extent of 10%."

UP woman found murdered in Surat flat, partner key suspect

IN WHAT police suspected to be a case of murder, a 20-year-old woman from Uttar Pradesh's Ambedkar Nagar was found dead at her rented accommodation in Palsana near here, police said, adding a team had left for the UP district to look for the man who lived with her.

Mehvizi Khatusn Afzal Ali died due to strangulation, police said, citing the post-mortem report.

Her body was found by po-

lice in the house located in Mahuram Apartments in Palsana's Bagumura on Sunday afternoon. Mehvizi hailed from Ambedkar Nagar's Shivpuri village. Citing neighbors, the police said Mehvizi and Shiv Singh Raneer Singh (25) had been living together for three months. Shiv Singh, also from UP, worked at a textile factory at Parbh village in Kamrej taluka, Palsana. Shiv Singh N Ganji registered an offence of murder at the Palsana police station. Palsana police inspector Bhagwanbhai Zilariya said,

"The two stayed together in a flat in Palsana. Shiv Singh is the primary suspect, and his whereabouts are unknown. We have sent a team to Ambedkar Nagar to catch him." "Mehvizi and Shiv Singh first eloped three years ago. Then her father lodged a complaint with Ambedkarnagar police against Shiv Singh, who was later arrested under charges of POCSO and rape, and was later released. Shiv Singh contacted Mehvizi again after she turned legal age, and the two eloped again a year ago."

6 of gang held in Jamnagar; GUJCTOC Act invoked

Jamnagar: Six persons belonging to a gang allegedly involved in 74 serious cases were arrested in Gujarat's Jamnagar district, a police official said on Thursday.

The stringent Gujarat Control of Terrorism and Organised Crime (GUJCTOC) Act has been invoked against the six, identified as Ghulam Saycha, Maheeb Saycha, Asgar Saycha, Hanif Saycha, Imtiyaz Saycha and Razak alias Razak Sidiq, he said. They are part of

the "Saycha gang", which is involved in offences such as murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, extortion, firing incidents, violations under the Arms Act, illegal money lending, land grabbing, criminal intimidation, gambling and illegal activities related crimes, said Jamnagar SP Ravi Mohan Saini.

The case under GUJCTOC Act was registered at Jamnagar City B Division police station. PTI

Polls to 4 RS seats in state on June 18: EC

Ahmedabad: The Election Commission (EC) on Friday declared the schedule to hold elections of four Rajya Sabha (RS) seats in Gujarat that are set to complete their term on June 21.

As per the schedule, voting for the elections will be held on

June 18 between 9 am and 4 pm.

The counting of votes will be done the same day at 5 pm, the EC said in a statement.

The elections will be notified on June 1 and the last date of nominations will be June 8. Scrutiny of nominations will

be done on June 9 and the last date to withdraw candidature will be June 11, said the statement. Three of the four seats are held by BJP members - Rambhai Mokariya, Narhari Amin and Ramilaben Bara. The fourth seat is held by Shaktisinh Gohil of Congress. ENS
